The Community Ratification Deed Poll

It is a requirement under the Rio Tinto Claim Wide Participation Agreement for all RRK people applying to be included on the Register of Beneficiaries to sign the Robe River Kuruma People Community Ratification Deed Poll.

This means that you are bound by the Claim Wide Participation Agreement and you promise to comply with the terms of the Robe River Kuruma People Claim Wide Participation Agreement, and that you confirm you are a Robe River Kuruma person.

1. Covenants given by each signatory

Each Signatory promises to RTIO that (without limiting the operation of the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement) they:

- a. are a member of the RRK People;
- b. are [a director of the Registered Native Title Body Corporate/an Applicant/a director of the [LAC]/a member of the [LAC]];
- c. authorised the Applicants [and [LAC]] to enter into the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement on their behalf; and
- d. are bound by and will observe, perform and comply with the provisions of the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement as [a member of the RRK People/a director of the Registered Native Title Body Corporate/an Applicant/a director of the [LAC]/a member of the [LAC]].

2. Voluntary execution

Each Signatory acknowledges and agrees that:

- a. they are aware of:
 - i. the contents of the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement; and
 - ii. how this deed poll interacts with the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement;
- b. they have voluntarily executed this deed poll;
- c. before the execution of this deed poll, they have obtained legal advice; and
- d. as a result of that legal advice, they understand the nature and effect of this deed poll and the RRK People Claim Wide Participation Agreement.

COMPLIANCE FRAMEWORK – Community Ratification Deed K&M People and RTIO Claim Wide Participation Agreement

BACKGROUND

The K&M People and RTIO Claim Wide Participation Agreement (**CWPA**) is a contract between RTIO and the Robe River Kuruma People (**RRK People**) that governs the relationship between the parties in respect of RTIO's mining activities on the land over which the RRK People are Traditional Owners.

The CWPA requires that each member of the RRK People agrees to be bound by, and comply with, the terms of the CWPA. To give effect to this requirement, individual members of the RRK People must enter into a K&M People Community Ratification Deed (**Deed**). Many RRK People participated in the authorisation of the CWPA and became members of Robe River Kuruma Aboriginal Corporation (**RRKAC**), and the legal effect of the CWPA was explained to RRK People during that process. However, since the CWPA was signed there are additional RRK People wishing to join RRKAC as members who must enter into a Deed.

It is important that RRK People understand the legal implications of entering into a Deed, prior to doing so. However, it is not practical or cost effective for each individual RRK Person to obtain legal advice prior to entering into a Deed. This Compliance Framework proposes that a practical approach be taken that:

- ensures RRK People have a reasonable opportunity to obtain information and general legal advice on the operation of the Deed;
- allows appropriate explanatory information to be provided in an accessible, cost effective and efficient manner; and
- provides RRKAC, as the Local Aboriginal Corporation (**LAC**), with a level of confidence that the requirements of the CWPA are complied with.

COMMUNITY RATIFICATION DEED

Who is required to enter into a Deed?

Under clause 8.4 of the CWPA, the RRK People (represented by the LAC) must ensure that the following people enter into a Deed:

- each director of the Registered Native Title Body Corporate (**RNTBC**) (if the RNTBC is the 'Applicant' for the purposes of the CWPA);
- each person that is named as an 'Applicant' in respect of a native title claim;
- each director of the LAC; and
- each member of the LAC.

What does each person agree by signing the Deed?

By signing a Deed, each person acknowledges and agrees that they:

- are aware of the contents of CWPA;
- understand that by signing the Deed they agree to be bound by the CWPA;
- received legal advice prior to signing the Deed;
- understand the legal implications of the Deed and the CWPA; and
- voluntarily entered into the Deed.
